(a) Original Unit: No change.

(b) Changes in Organization:

(1) Regimental Headquarters, Headquarters Company and Service Company were attached to Division Reserve throughout the period.

(2) 1st Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was attached to Combat Command "A" from 1 September to 24 September, at which time they reverted to Division Reserve and remained in Division Reserve for the remainder of the period.

(3) 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was attached to Combat Command "B" from 1 September to 18 September. From 18 September through 24 September this Bn. reverted to Division Reserve. For the period 25 September until the close of the period they were attached to Combat Command "A".

(4) 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was a part of Division Reserve for the period 1 September through 11 September. The Bn. was then attached to Combat Command "B" as a part of Task Force Lovelady but reverted to the Division Reserve on 23 September. This Bn. was again attached to Combat Command "B" 26 September and was a part of Task Force Lovelady for the remaining portion of the period.

(g) Battles:

1 September 1944. FC No. 12, 3rd Armored Division, was put into effect at 0700. Division Reserve (Col. Leone)

made a steady advance during the day but was held up by a destroyed bridge. A bridgehead was secured and late in the day a bridge was constructed at 385483. At the close of the period Division Reserve had its leading elements in Hersen at 385530.

2 September 1944. The attack was continued at 0700 towards Mons. Combat Command "B" was unable to move until 1200 because their trains had been cut off and no fuel was available. At 1600, Combat Command "A", of which 1st Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was a part, crossed the Belgium border and had its leading elements in Mons at 1900. Division Reserve encountered moderate resistance during the day and knocked out 10 enemy tanks. Lt. Col. Hutcheson assumed command vice Col. Louis Leone relieved. Lt. Col. Hutcheson assumed command of the Division Reserve as well as the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment.

3 September 1944. FO No. 13 was received and listed troops as follows:

Division Reserve was closed in assembly area at 0030 at 341054. About 20 minutes thereafter the assembly area was attacked by 3 enemy tanks and 15 dismounted infantrymen. 2 enemy tanks were knocked out and 1 was abandoned. The enemy suffered 8 men killed while our losses were 1 killed and 2 wounded. The Reserve sent out mopping up parties during the day and prisoners and supplies were taken. Road blocks were posted and our defensive position were strengthened.

4 September 1944. Division Reserve attacked over assigned routes (Route No. 2). Combat Command "A" met heavy resistance which held up advance and Reserve did not leave assembly area until 1700. March of 34.9 miles was made and Reserve stopped in vicinity of Charleroi.

5 September 1944. Reserve left assembly area at 1400 and continued towards Namur. Both Combat Commands had attacked at 0630 and reached their objective after overcoming several enemy pockets. Combat Command "A" occupied Northern part of Namur and Combat Command "B" the Southern part. Our column was constantly covered by air throughout the day. Prisoners continued to be captured in large numbers. The Reserve had closed in its assembly area before the close of the period.

6 September 1944 Col. C. J. Rosenberger joined and assumed command of the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment and Division Reserve. Col. Rosenberger joined by liaison plane as no routes were open to our positions. Division Reserve was given the mission of securing the West of Liege or to be prepared to go to the rear.

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of Combat Command "A" or Combat Command "B". Division Reserve left assembly area at 1800 following Combat Command "A". Slight resistance was met and all units coiled about the close of the period.

7 September 1944. Attack was continued against moderate resistance. Division Reserve reached and occupied its objective by the close of the period. CP was set up at Fort de Hollogne just West of Liege.

8 September 1944. Road blocks were set up at all critical points and road block No. 3 at 414328 knocked out 7 enemy tanks and killed and wounded an unknown number of enemy. Our force suffered 1 man wounded. Combat Command "A" and Combat Command "B" sent strong patrols into town and they met only scattered resistance. Liege was cleared by 1810 and at the close of the period all units were ready to move forward again.

9 September 1944. Combat Commands attacked during the morning towards Verviers. Division Reserve moved at 1900 against little resistance. The Reserve went into assembly area in vicinity of Romsee near the close of the period.

10 September 1944. Both Combat Commands continued the attack towards Verviers and progressed satisfactorily. Division Reserve continued from its assembly area and moved into a new position South West of Verviers about 2100. Road blocks were set up by the 703rd TD Bn. and 3rd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment.

11 September 1944. Moved out of assembly area about 1615, with mission of securing Eupen. Division's objective now Erschweiler. Area was reached and CP set up South West of Eupen at close of period. Little enemy resistance was met by any units.

12 September 1944. Division Reserve now in assembly area on the South West side of Eupen. Road blocks were established in the area and a patrol was sent to Limbourg. The patrol reported mines and a bridge out. Following troops now in Division Reserve:

(Service trains and Regimental Headquarters of the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment are also in this group.)

13 September 1944. The 1st Bn. 26th Inf. went to Combat Command "A" at 0800 hours. The remainder of the Reserve spent the morning cleaning equipment and doing badly need maintenance. Plans and reconnaissance were made of a new assembly position. Division Reserve changed assembly positions commencing at 1800 to a position about 1 mile East of Raeren. 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment (-G Co.) had previously reverted to Combat Command "B" at 1450 hours. Element of the Division made the initial breach in the Siegfried Line and made strong patrols into Germany meeting anti-tank and

and small arms fire, mines and road blocks. 3rd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment reverted to Combat Command "A" at 2100 hours.

14 September 1944. There was no activity on any of the road blocks during the night. 3rd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment departed for Combat Command "A" at 0650. Both Combat Commands attacked at 0800 as per Division's order. Combat Command "A" met strong resistance but advanced slowly. Task Force Lovelady and Task Force King of Combat Command "B" were advancing well at 1100. Major George Mills assumed command of Task Force King and Lt. Col. King was evacuated about 1200 hours. Task Force Mills and Task Force Planchard were both held up by blown bridges during the afternoon and coiled about 1800. Task Force Dorn made a rapid advance during the afternoon and coiled at coordinates 895435 at 1800 hours. Task Force Lovelady continued to advance during the afternoon and coiled at 955390 about 1800 hours. Division Reserve (Task Force Hogan) protected the left flank of the Division and continued to hold road blocks in the vicinity of 833314.

15 September 1944. There was no activity on the road blocks of the Division Reserve during the night. Col. Rosenberger was called to Division at 0740. Reserve was alerted at 1000 hours for a move to a new assembly position. 1st Bn. 26th Inf. now a part of Task Force Hogan. Reserve started to move to new area at 1415 through Raeran to South West of Kornelimunster and closed there at 1915 hours. Reserve moved again at 1945 hours for still a newer area just North East of Dorff. Mission of Reserve is to establish road blocks in front of Division CP and to close the gap between Combat Commands. Series of 12 road blocks were established and were manned by Task Force Hogan's forces and the 703rd TD Bn. CP of the Reserve is at 915392. During the day, Task Force Dorn (1st Bn 36th Armored Infantry Regiment a part) and Task Force Lovelady (2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment a part) breached the main defenses in the Siegfried Line and had established considerable bridgeheads by the close of the period.

16 September 1944. Road blocks were completed by 0300 and there was no activity during the night. During the morning, the 83rd Recon. Bn., operating North of Dorff towards Busbach, was assisted by a road block of the 703rd TD Bn. with direct fire against a pill box. Commanding Officer, Division Reserve, called a unit commander's meeting at 1300 hours. Task Force Adams (Maj. Adams, Commanding Officer, 1st Bn. 26th Inf.) was formed with the mission of clearing the town of Busbach and advancing to the second barrier of the Siegfried Line just North of the town. Task Force Adams consisted of 1st Bn. 26th Inf., Co. G 33rd Armored Regiment, a platoon of tank destroyers and engineers on call. The 54th FA Bn. furnished FO's and a IO. The Task Force attacked at 1520 and by 1830 had advanced to the main cross roads North of the town. Enemy resistance at first consisted of mortar and small arms fire but later a tank was lost to anti-tank fire. Our casualties were light and about 50 prisoners were taken. Task Force Adams coiled for the night in and around Busbach and sent patrols to reconnoiter the dragon teeth defenses to the front. Task Force Adams was contacted at 2100 and told to report his exact front line positions and not to move after 170600. At 2115, all units in the Reserve were notified that at 170300 the time would revert to 170200 and become "A" instead of "B". During the day, both Combat Commands pushed infantry attacks against very heavy resistance.

17 September 1944. At 0330, S-3 of the 1st Bn. 26th Inf., gave a detailed report as to his units location and activities during the night. Road blocks all reported no activity during the night. Task Force Adams received small arms and anti-tank fire during the morning. Both Combat Commands received air support during the morning. The remainder of Division Reserve was alerted at 1200 for possible employment to the left of Busbach where the 16th Inf. was receiving a counter-attack. At 1330 Lt. Col. Hogan reported for alert instructions. He was told to reconnoiter for a route to a point 4 kilometers East of Busbach. At this time, Combat Command "2" was receiving a very heavy counter-attack in the vicinity of Mausbach. Major Pike of 23rd Eng. Bn. reported at 1345 and was ordered to take over the road blocks that had been manned by the 3rd Bn. 33rd Armd. Regiment. 3rd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment was assembled in the vicinity of Dorff and held in readiness. Co. C 26th Inf. reverted to Combat Command "E" and was ordered to move to the vicinity of Mausbach to make a limited objective attack to relieve the pressure on Task Force Lovelady. This move was made by truck at 1700. Col. Rosenberger and Lt. Col. Hogan attended a conference at Division CP in regard to an attack by Task Force Hogan towards Mausbach with the high ground around Duffenter as his objective. The Task Force was to consist of 3rd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment (- C Co.) and 1st Bn. 26th Inf. 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment suffered very heavy casualties during the enemy counter-attack on Combat Command "E" by enemy tanks and infantry. Companies D & E were particularly hard hit but it is believed that some men from Company E were cut-off and captured.

18 September 1944. Task Force Hogan was alerted and reverted to Division control at 0700. The security of Busbach was taken over by the 83rd Recon. Bn (-2 Ccs.) with Division Reserve supporting them. Lt. Col. Yeomans, Commanding Officer, 83rd Recon. Bn., reported to CP Division Reserve to coordinate the defense of Busbach with road blocks maintained by the Reserve. LO, Capt. R. W. Russell reported small arms and anti-tank fire along the positions of the 83rd Recon. Bn. at 1145. 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment and 2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment reverted to Division Res. at 1700. Both units reported into the proper radio nets, were bivouaced around Dorff and closed there at 2030. Both units needed reorganization and refitting badly and work was started immediately.

19 September 1944. Refitting and reorganization was carried out during the day by the 2nd Bn. of the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment and 2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment. Co. F of the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment did not report with the Bn. as it is on a special mission. At 1635, 5 enemy tanks were reported North of Busbach. Lt. Col. Miller, Commanding Officer 2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment, was called to OP. At 1800, enemy infantry was reported as coming back into Busbach by infiltration. At this time Task Force Miller (2nd Bn. 32nd Armd. Regt. and D Co. 23rd Eng. Bn.) was alerted to meet this threat. Col. Rosenberger met Gen. Rose in Busbach about 1835 to receive instructions. Task Force Miller moved out about 1840 and moved into position. At 2030 the S-3 section and a Recon. section Regt. Recon.) moved to a forward CP location at 925401. The remainder of the period was quiet for Division Reserve. Throughout the period both Combat Commands continued to mop up in their areas and to strengthen their positions.

20 September 1944. CP moved slightly to gain more room in some nearby buildings. At 1045 Co. D 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was attached to 83rd Recon. Bn. to help clear Busbach and at 1100 1 platoon of medium tanks of Co. E 32nd Armored Regiment was attached for the same purpose. Task Force Yeomans attacked about 1230 and reported small arms fire as resistance. Col. Rosenberger was directed by message (rec'd 1335) to take over positions held by Task Force Yeomans, to protect Combat Force at cross roads at 929412 and to initiate reconnaissance North of Stolberg. This mission was given to Task Force Miller. 1 platoon of Co. E 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was attached to Task Force Mills about 1400. Task Force Miller secured the passage through the dragon's teeth about 1800. Our casualties were very light and Task Force Miller took 81 prisoners and knocked out several pill boxes with direct tank fire. Forward CP was moved back to the rear CP in the vicinity of Dorff and closed there at 1915.

21 September 1944. All road blocks reports as well as the reports of Task Force Miller were that all was quiet during the night. At 1000 hours Co. E 36th Armored Infantry Regiment (- 1 plt) was sent to join Task Force Blanchard North of Busbach. All units of Division Reserve in the immediate Busbach area were unable to do maintenance as per Division order for they were engaged and snipers in the area were particularly active. Division Reserve was assigned a new assembly area and reconnaissance was initiated during the morning. Orders were received and transmitted to Task Force Miller that he was to remain on his present assignment. The tank destroyers with Task Force Miller were to revert to 703rd Tank Destroyer Bn. at 220630. Special Service Officer, Lt. Philip Zulli, arranged for movies, clubmobiles and a USO show during the afternoon for all Reserve units not engaged.

22 September 1944. Unit commanders meeting was called at 0830 to prepare for move to new assembly area. A billiting party departed at 0830 to prepare the area and Division Reserve moved at 1000 with Regimental CP group closing at 1130 at coordinates 951395. Co. E 36th Armored Infantry Regiment (- 1 plt) reverted to Division guard at 0800 hours and relieved Co. G 36th Armored Infantry Regiment which went to Combat Command "B". Per Division's instructions, Col. Rosenberger issued the following order at 1500 to Lt. Col. Miller by lasion:

"2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment with 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment (-Cos. E & F) attached will proceed immediately and take up a position in readiness in the vicinity of 955413 prepared to repel a counter-attack against the 47th Inf." At 1555, Capt. Tousey was given instructions to move to the position and be joined there by Lt. Col. Miller with his force. Task Force Miller moved and took up the positions indicated without any resistance. Reserve CP moved to a new location at 956402 and closed at 1900, four road blocks were set up on roads leading into the Reserve area and were manned by the 703rd TD Bn. and 23rd Eng. Bn. Capt. Patterson assumed command of 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment when Maj. R. T. Dunn was evacuated.

23 September 1944. All units reported no activity during the night. Reconnaissance was made for the occupation of a defensive sector by elements of the Division Reserve. Co. E 36th Armored Infantry Regiment (- 1 plt) reverted to 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment at 0800 and was put into the defensive situation with the **Bn.**

24 September 1944. There was no enemy activity reported by any units of the Division Reserve during the night. CP was shelled between 2400 and 0100 and two men were wounded slightly. Lt. Col. Orr, Commanding Officer 1st Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, reported to CP at 0730 in regard to effecting relief of Task Force Lovelady and 1st Bn. 47th Inf. Col. Rosenberger relieved of command of 36th Armored Infantry Regiment and Division Reserve. Plans were continued for relief of units within the Division so as to allow a rotation of units to effect maintenance and reorganization. Col. L. L. Doan, Commanding Officer 32nd Armored Regiment, reported about 1100 to assist with relief plan. Division sent down a operations memorandum which was to be followed. At 1700, Lt. Col. Jack R. Hutcheson, Executive Officer 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, was evacuated because of severe rheumatism. The initial relief was made from about 1900 and continued through the remainder of the period with Task Force Orr (1st Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment and 2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment) relieving Task Force Lovelady.

25 September 1944. Task Force Orr completed his relief during the early part of this period. His sector was quiet during the day except for occasional shelling by mortars and artillery. In turn, our FC's harrassed the enemy with assault guns, 81 mm mortar and artillery fire throughout the day. The relief plan continued with Task Force Kane (1st Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment and 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment) relieving Task Force Hogan and Task Force Mills at 1815. Task Force Richardson then moved into a reserve position prepared to support either Task Force Orr or Kane. His Task Force (3rd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment and 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment) was to continue maintenance and reorganization in this reserve position (955415). Task Force Kane reverted to Combat Command "A" in their position at 1830.

26 September 1944. Road blocks and patrols made negative reports throughout the night. First light reports revealed no activity on any of the fronts. Task Force Orr received light mortar and artillery fire during the morning. Some machine guns were located in the sector of Co. C and tanks were moved in to fire direct fire on those positions. During the morning, Capt. Hemphill assumed command of 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment. During the afternoon Co. A 36th Armored Infantry Regiment located 5 tanks of the 33rd Armored Regiment. One of these tanks (a "76") was in good condition and it was started and put into position for defensive fire. The second tank had a broken track and the third tank had burned. Task Force Orr, from good observation points, continued to put mortar and artillery fire on the enemy.

27 September 1944. Road blocks and first light reports indicated all quiet on the front. Intermittant artillery fire continued to fall on Task Force Orr throughout the night. It was believed that the Germans were using artillery fire to cover the movement of their tanks. However reports received at 0720 indicated that all was quiet on all fronts and the situation remained quiet for the remainder of the period. Lt. Col. Fowler joined the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment and assumed command of the 3rd Bn. of this Regiment.

28 September 1944. First light reports from all units in-

icated a quiet night with occasional fire. At 0800 a meeting was held at the Regimental CP for the purpose of coordinating the relief of the Division Reserve by Combat Command "B". Officers attendings were Brig. Gen. Boudinot, Lt. Cols. Lovelady, Richardson, Miller, Orr and Fowler, Majs. Mills and Albro and the Regimental Staff of the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment. Gen. Boudinot issued orders to effect the relief by Combat Command "B" of positions occupied by Task Force Orr. The 2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment was relieved by 2nd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment at 1930 and 1st Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment relieved the 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment at 2145. 1st platoon Co. A, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment established on the road blocks at Mausbach.

29 September 1944. Negative reports received throughout the night concerning activity on the road blocks and within the Division Reserve area. The Division Reserve now consists of:

The 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment is now attached to Combat Command "A" and is part of Task Force Kane. The 3rd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment is attached to Combat Command "E" and in Task Force Lovelady. Plans were formulated for the relief of the elements of the 2nd Bn. 32nd Armored Regiment on the road blocks at Mausbach by elements of 3rd Bn. 33rd Armored Regiment.

30 September 1944. The situation remained quiet throughout the night and the units of the Division Reserve continued their maintenance and reorganization throughout the day. Units not engaged were trying to familiarize their replacements with the various weapons. Many replacements in the Regiment have never qualified on the machine gun and trained machine gunners and mortar men are scarce. Reports received in the early evening indicated that the anti-tank platoon from 2nd Bn. 36th Armored Infantry Regiment received a heavy shelling and 5 casualties were reported. Also during the early part of the evening the troops on the road block at Mausbach reported finding an abandoned friendly tank. Capt. Stoddard, Company Commander A Co. Maintenance Bn, was contacted and plans were initiated for the recovery of the vehicle.



6. NARRATIVE BATTLE REPORT:

On 1 September 1944, the Combat Command advanced from Rozoy to the vicinity of Landouzy, where a blown bridge and enemy resistance with artillery, mortars, nebelwerfers and small arms made a river crossing necessary. The destroyed bridge was put in shape for a crossing by the Combat Command engineers, and the advance resumed to the vicinity of Avesnes, where the command halted for the night. During this day's operation, 50 PW were taken and 2 tanks with many half-tracks and other vehicles destroyed. During the afternoon, the CP was shelled with a net loss to the CP of 2 killed and 5 wounded. Another man was evacuated from exhaustion. On the following day, the advance continued through Maubeuge, where friendly civilians showed the way over the river to avoid the bridge destroyed by the withdrawing Germans, to a position just south of Mons. Both columns fought against German rearguards of AT and infantry. This unit was the first part of the division to cross the Belgian border. By about 1700 hours on 2 Sept., the leading elements of the command had reached and sent patrols thru Mons.

The balance of the day and the night were spent in establishing road blocks and patrols through the Mons area. On 3 Sept. many encounters were had with enemy groups trying to move north and east through the blocks established. Many enemy vehicles were destroyed, including tanks and trucks. Several towed AT guns were knocked out. At this stage the enemy appeared to be generally disorganized, with little or no knowledge of the position of our troops. In two days in this area the command took about 3500 prisoners including 3 general officers. On 4 Sept. the command continued to hold its positions until relieved by the 1st Inf. Div. At noon, the command moved out with the objective of reaching Charleroi, and late in the evening, bivouaced for the night on the east side of the city. Only light opposition was encountered on this day. On 5 Sept. the advance continued to Namur. During this day's operation, the 347th Inf. Div. (enemy) was encountered. The 860th and 861st Inf. Regiments were badly shot up, as was the 347th Artillery Regiment. Over 400 prisoners were taken, and 10 150-mm howitzers, 6 AT guns, several mortars, a number of trucks and many horse-drawn vehicles captured or destroyed. During the night, patrolling of Namur was carried on to find crossings over the river.

On 6 Sept. the advance was delayed slightly by lack of gasoline, and the command did not move out till 1500 hours and then advanced as far as Antheit, encountering AT opposition in the vicinity of Wareth-Chausée. On 7 Sept. the advance continued to the vicinity of Andenne and Huy. On the next day a further short advance was made, lack of gas again hampering operations. On 9 Sept. the enemy was driven from the west bank of the Meuse River in the vicinity of Liege, several flak batteries defending the city, notably one of twelve guns, being destroyed. On the 10th, bridge reconnaissance was made for crossings over the Meuse, and as soon as CC"B" had cleared the east bank of the river, construction of a ponton bridge was started. On the 11th the Meuse was crossed and CC"A" moved to the vicinity of Herve. The 105th Panzer Brigade was encountered and several tanks destroyed. Positions were taken up in the vicinity of Dison and Verviers. On the succeeding day, mopping up operations were conducted and reconnaissance of the first line of the Siegfried Line made. On this date troops of the division first crossed the German border. On 13 Sept. the first

line was breached by the combined efforts of our engineers, tanks and infantry. Heavy small arms fire from the bunkers, and intense heavy mortar fire from positions behind, backed up with AT fire from mobile guns behind the bunkers, made the crossing of the dragon's tooth obstacles and the reduction of the necessary number of bunkers very difficult. The 14th was spent in advancing to and reconnoitering the second line of defenses and mopping up the area held.

On the 15th the second line of the Siegfried defenses was breached and the town of Büsbach cleared. Opposition was very stubborn, with more artillery than at any time since the breakthrough at St. Lo. Mortars, small arms, and fresh troops made the opposition more effective. Fortunately, the advance had been so rapid that the enemy was unable to get all his defensive troops in place prior to the attack, or it would have been even more costly. The anti-tank guns in this instance held their fire, as did the tanks backing up the line, until 6 tanks had passed through the obstacle line, at which time all 6 were knocked out, but our infantry was not displaced. On the 16th an infantry advance was attempted with the tanks giving fire support, but the attack moved slowly and by darkness only a limited advance had been made. On the 17th, the enemy attempted a rather strong counterattack with elements of the 12th Inf. Div., the main strength of which fell against the 1st Inf. Div. on our left, but about two companies lapped over onto the front of CC"A". By noon this attack had been completely broken up, and after it was stopped, our infantry made a small advance against intense small arms and mortar fire. The 18th of Sept. was spent in repelling small counterattacks, none of which reached sizeable proportions on the front of CC"A", and in the reconnaissance and development of positions on the slag piles north of the town of Munsterbusch.

The town itself was a major obstacle, some of the houses being only dummies. These were actually pillboxes with a fake house erected over them. The whole industrial complex in the vicinity of Stolberg presented a major obstacle to armor, with its small complement of infantry for outpost, patrol and mop-up purposes. The 19th and 20th were spent in the mopping up and consolidation of positions held, and on the 21st, CC"A" was relieved in the Munsterbusch sector by the 16th Inf.

For three days the headquarters was virtually shorn of troops while a rest period was in force, and on the 25th the command took over the left of the division sector, running through Stolberg generally to the north of the 43 east-west grid.

This position was maintained to the end of the month, with little but the relief of the troops actually holding the line occurring. At any time, evidence of activity on the sector was sufficient to draw down heavy mortar and artillery fire. Contact along the line was close, with enemy outposts frequently not more than fifty to one hundred yards from our front.

6. Narrative Battle Report

On the night of 31 August - 1 September 1944, the Unit was bivouaced South of BRUNEHALLEL. Orders were received to continue attack to the Objective (LANDOUZY). At 0700 the movement began. By 0900 leading elements were in LANDOUZY, and the column began coiling North of town. Instructions were received to continue the attack to the North, with MONS, Belgium, as the final Objective. When forward elements reached the railroad overpass South of ORIGNY, the railroad was blown, blocking the main road. Several hundred yards beyond the bridges on the THON RIVER were blasted. A by-pass route to the West was used to move around the blocked overpass. Infantry got over the river, opposing stiff resistance, and established a bridgehead, allowing the Engineers to repair the bridge. The advance was resumed at 1615. At LES BRAS, four enemy trucks were destroyed. Anti-tank fire was encountered at 305583, and one Ek V tank was destroyed North of this point. Bivouac position for the night was in the vicinity of TATAMONT (370680).

At 0700, 2 September 1944, Task Force "X" advanced to AVESNES and linked with Task Force "Y". The town was cleared of enemy infantry and at 1035 the advance was resumed toward the North. Small arms and AT fire was encountered at FELLERIES. One AT Gun was destroyed. A bypass route via EEUGLIES and DIMONT was taken to continue advance. Movement was rapid to ASSEVENT, where AT fire was again met. One gun was destroyed, and the advance continued. Forward elements crossed the French-Belgian Border at 1615, continuing on to MONS. Road blocks were established on all roads leading out of town, and the main body moved to an area South-east of town.

On 3 September 1944, patrols were sent to the North of town, and active patrols were kept in town. One road block destroyed two trucks towing two 88-mm guns, and captured 34 prisoners. Orders were received in the afternoon, assigning a new objective (NAMUR), with CHARLERCI as the intermediate objective.

The Command started moving to assembly area East of ST DENNIS at 1000, 4 September, for attack to objective via THIER - BELLECOURT - GOSSELIES - LAMBUSART - SOMBRETTE - RJ 867140 - DAVESSE - NAMUR. At 1400, the attack began, and movement was very rapid to intermediate objective NE of CHARLERCI (720116) where forward elements arrived at 1730. At this point, heavy enemy artillery and mortar fire was received. The Regimental Commanding Officer was wounded, and the Executive Officer, Lt. Col. John K. Boles Jr, assumed Command. A defensive position was taken for the night, and road blocks established on the area perimeter.

On 5 September 1944, the attack for the final objective began at 0700. Anti-tank fire was met very soon (at FLENRUS). This was soon followed by mortar fire. The advance was slow, and was accomplished by routing one company of tanks to the right flank. Small arms fire and artillery fire was encountered along the route. One mile Southwest of KAZY, forward elements ran into an enemy horse-drawn column, and

inflicted heavy casualties. Remnants of this column were found for four miles. Six 150-mm Howitzers, two 81-mm Guns, two 81-mm Mortars, two 47-mm AT Guns, six trucks and fifteen horse-drawn vehicles were known destroyed. In addition, four enemy 155-mm guns were destroyed by the enemy to prevent being captured. Approximately 200 prisoners were captured. Time did not permit an accurate count.

Upon orders from Combat Command "A", defensive position was taken up two miles Northwest of HANBUR, (920120) at 1700. The railroad underpasses along the route were found to be blown.

A new objective of LIEGE was assigned during the night, and plans were made to continue attack to the East. In the late afternoon, Col. Leander L. Doan, Regimental Commanding Officer, although wounded, returned to Command.

On 6 September 1944, movement was held up initially pending arrival of necessary fuel. All vehicles were refueled in afternoon, and loading elements started moving at 1500. A by-pass route via LIVOT - RHINES - ESINES - FRIZET was used to cross the railroad. Anti-tank and small arms fire was encountered Southeast of TILLIER. An enemy column of seven trucks (Division Headquarters vehicles, 48th Infantry Division) was met at 120225. These were destroyed and four officers and 22 men captured. Defensive position was taken up for the night at 165215, where 53 prisoners were captured. Reconnaissance was initiated for a bridge to cross the MEUSE RIVER.

Early in the morning of 7 September, Lt. Col. Richardson, CO, 3rd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, reported a usable bridge at 187214. The column moved out at 0700, across this bridge. This bridge was being prepared for demolition by the enemy, but our troops seized the bridge so quickly that the enemy did not have sufficient time to blow it. Advance was quick through VINALMONT - VILLERS LE BOILLET - YERHANE - HORIZON, where the column was coiled on orders from CC "A" at 1355. The advance was resumed at 1500, and AT and artillery fire was received. This was bypassed, and by 1645 leading elements were on the outskirts of LIEGE. The Task Force was assembled two miles West of town (427303). CC "A" directed a reconnaissance to be made of bridges across the MEUSE RIVER, and move to East side of the river if possible; but all bridges were found to be blown.

On 8 September 1944, patrols were kept active in the section of town West of the MEUSE RIVER.

By 9 September, Engineer troops had completed a pontoon bridge across the river, and orders were received to move to an assembly area across the river in the vicinity of BEYNE-HEUSAY (530270), and be prepared to attack East. Route to be followed was AYENEUX - BAS BOIS - RJ 617267 - MANAIHANT - DISON, with high ground in vicinity of DISON (North VERVIERS) as the objective. At 1150 the column started moving to the assembly area, and at 1540 began to attack East from assembly area. Leading elements ran into enemy AT fire and some infantry 1,000 yards West of RJ 617276. These were taken under fire by artillery and tanks, and the two AT guns were destroyed. The advance continued, and just beyond the road junction, 5 enemy trucks were destroyed. Anti-tank fire was encountered again West of MANAIHANT. One Mk IV tank was located and destroyed. The advance continued, and within the next mile, leading elements ran into four enemy trucks, which were destroyed. By 2315, the Task Force was closed in on the objective (high ground North of DISON) (674267).

On 10 September, Company "C", 32nd Armored Regiment, under command of Captain Maxwell, was sent out to patrol to the East. The patrol reached the outskirts of LIMBOURG and were unable to advance beyond. 3rd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, and one Company of the 36th Armored Infantry Regiment was sent at daylight to secure the area of road junction (577272) upon orders from CC "A". Later in the day, 3rd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, was detached from Regimental Control, and replaced by 2nd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, commanded by Major William Bailey. The 2nd Battalion did not join the Force during the day. During the night, orders were received from CC "A" assigning an objective just beyond the German Border at LICHTENBUSCH, with an intermediate objective one mile West of WALHORN. The route to be followed was

LOHIRVILLE - AUNEG - WELKENRAEDT - LANTZEN, and intermediate objective. At 0950, 11 September, the attack started over the assigned route. Opposition was met at LOHIRVILLE (mortar fire and Tank fire), and enemy infantry was seen running into the woods to the Southeast. Leading elements deployed and spotted one enemy Mk V tank. This was destroyed by fire from our tanks. Friendly air cover was good, and they reported seeing six tanks in front of us that had been flushed by our tanks. Air began working over the area to our front, and after 45 minutes the enemy fire had ceased and forward movement was resumed. The advance was rapid to WELKENRAEDT, where 2 enemy Mk V tanks were met. The enemy was attempting to withdraw from the town, and was somewhat disorganized. The 2 tanks were fired on by our tanks, and both destroyed at 754306. 1,000 yards beyond (765304), lead tanks ran into an enemy column attempting a retreat. Three trucks, one 88-mm towed gun, one half-track, and another half-track mounting four 20-mm anti-aircraft guns were destroyed. After this point, the advance to the intermediate objective was rapid, and the column closed in in a defensive position on the intermediate objective at 1804.

On the morning of 12 September 1944, Company "F", 32nd Armored Regiment, was assigned a South route of advance to final objective, via WALKORN - LANGHUS - HAGBENDEN - BERLOTTE - LANGFELD. The remainder of the Task Force was to advance over route RJ 800-330 - JOHBERG - EYNATTEN - LICHTENBUSCH. The terrain was very favorable for the enemy. On the left, and extending around to the front, was a high ridge affording excellent observation. Company "F" was designated as "A" Column, and the remainder of the Task Force as "B" Column. Company "F" advanced to the vicinity of BERLOTTE, where they received heavy anti-tank fire. The left (North) column moved out and advanced to EYNATTEN, where heavy anti-tank fire was met and three tanks lost. The anti-tank fire could not be located. Enemy mortar fire was placed on the road leading into town, and air bursts from 88-mm guns were over the roads. A by-pass route cross country South of EYNATTEN was taken. The new route followed was KINKELBAHN - RAERAN - BERLOTTE. This route was better concealed and observation for the enemy was more difficult. At 1638, Company "F" reached the German Border at 868347. The two columns joined and assembled for the night in this location, West of the Border. Three patrols were sent out during the night to reconnoiter the dragons' teeth and defenses of the Siegfried Line, which began approximately 1,000 yards in front of leading elements. One patrol, to the right, went through the dragons' teeth and some distance beyond. They reported the area not suitable for tanks, but encountered no enemy. The center patrol ran into the enemy before reaching the line, and could give no information on fortifications. The left patrol worked through the woods, reconnoitered the dragons' teeth, and stated that they saw no enemy and found no anti-tank ditches. The Task Force had been assigned the objective of breaking through the line and advancing to ESCHWEILER.

At 0430, 13 September 1944, plans were made for breaching the line. The medium tanks of 2nd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, were to move at 0700 and deploy along a line of departure in the woods from 869359 to 871356. The 1st Battalion, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, supported by the tanks, was to advance through the dragons' teeth and seize the high ground beyond. Then Combat Command Engineers, (Company "A", 23rd Armored Engineer Battalion, commanded by Captain Replogle) were to blast a breach in the dragons' teeth, allowing the tanks to get through. The infantry pushed about 1,000 yards, and advanced through the dragons' teeth, about 200 yards. As they advanced over the crest, they were suddenly swept by machine-gun fire from a pillbox at 875375, and were forced to withdraw to the dragons' teeth for protection. Colonel Doan then ordered the infantry to move to the left along the dragons' teeth and attack the pillbox from the West. This maneuver was carried out, but heavy machine-gun fire was encountered from another pillbox to the left. For the third time, the infantry tried to push beyond the dragons' teeth, but without success. Ten tanks were sent up and deployed along the dragons' teeth to support the infantry, and the Engineers moved

to place demolitions in the dragons' teeth. About 1400, heavy enemy mortar fire began falling in the area. About 1500, a roadway was reported about 300 yards to the right, but thought to be mined. It was then decided to go through the roadway. The roadway was constructed of stone and earth, probably for the convenience of local population. A platoon of four tanks, headed by a flail-tank, was sent to investigate. The flail-tank ran off the crossing and stalled, blocking the passage. Lt John R. Hoffman dismounted and hitched two tanks to the flail-tank and pulled it out. Then the tanks went through and encountered no mines. Immediately the remainder of the tanks were ordered through the passage. About 1550, all 20 tanks were across the dragons' teeth. The tanks began to cruise the pillbox area, and within a few minutes had destroyed several 88-mm guns and cleaned out six pillboxes. Immediately after this a hail of enemy artillery began falling in the area. Captain Flummer, the Infantry Battalion Commander, was wounded. The tanks advanced northward and ran into heavy fire from the North and Northeast. Other pillboxes, 88s, and possibly heavier guns in that direction, to the South of OBER FORSTBACH, were being used by the enemy with telling effect. Several of our tanks were knocked out in a short space of time, and Lt. Col. Tilford, the Tank Battalion Commander, was killed.

Due to the tanks being knocked out, and the absence of key commanders, communications were very disrupted. The Regimental CO had great difficulty in assembling the tanks to proceed forward NUTHEIM, to tie in with the 1st Battalion, 26th Infantry. The latter unit had been ordered to take NUTHEIM from the West. Several more of our tanks were knocked out by anti-tank guns from the vicinity of OBER FORSTBACH. At about 1800, there were only 10 tanks left in operation. The Regimental Commander radioed Combat Command that he needed "more stuff to get through". Two tank platoons from 1st Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, were sent forward and joined the original tank force about 1900. About one hour later, the reorganized tanks and 1st Battalion, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, proceeded up the draw toward NUTHEIM. The force had delayed for our artillery to be brought to bear on enemy forces along the road which crosses the draw at 884358. Two of our tanks were knocked out of action by fire from this direction. After the artillery was lifted, the 1st Battalion, 36th Infantry, followed by 2nd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, proceeded to a point just West of NUTHEIM (889363), and began organizing the area for defense. Shortly afterwards, the 1st Battalion, 16th Infantry, arrived and defenses were tied in with them. Only 8 of the original 20 tanks were left in operation at the end of the day.

In the morning of 14 September, TF "X" was ordered to move to the North about four miles to the vicinity of EILENDORF (8943). The advance started about noon, and except for a short skirmish at BRAND, there was not much considerable fighting. The outskirts of EILENDORF were reached at about 1930 (893423). Patrols were sent out during the night to feel out the enemy.

At daylight, 15 September, a platoon of the 36th Infantry began patrolling to the West of EILENDORF. A platoon of light tanks, under Captain Maxwell, was sent out to the Northwest to patrol the area. Ten pillboxes were inspected by the tank platoon in this area, and found to be unmanned. This patrol then proceeded to 880440 to support the infantry patrol which had gone in that direction. Enemy infantry was found dug in along the North side of the railroad tracks at 873447. About noon, orders were received from CC "A" for the Task Force to turn right and advance to SCHNEIDMUEHLE. 1st Battalion, 16th Infantry, now occupied the area just Southwest of the dragons' teeth at this point (905427). The 3rd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, moved out to this point. The infantry there had been receiving intense fire from pillboxes in the area, and were pinned down. Under cover of tanks, they withdrew slightly to the rear. The tanks found an opening in the second line of dragons' teeth, barred only by a few old farm wagons. These the tanks pushed aside

and started through. After proceeding about 300 yards to the Northeast, intense AT fire was received by the leading tank. By this time, 8 tanks were through the gap. AT fire from concealed positions was so intense that in a short time 6 of our tanks were knocked out. 1st Battalion, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, was then ordered forward to clean out the resistance. The infantry advanced to the road junction at GUISBERG and moved up the road to the Northeast until it reached the road junction at 918437. Here the infantry fanned out, forming a horse-shoe with the road as an axis, and dug in for defensive position for the night. Patrolling was then done throughout the night.

On 16 September 1944, one company of tanks was sent through the dragons' teeth to support the infantry. In the late afternoon, an attempt was made to advance to the hill at SCHNEIDMUEHLE. After moving forward about 100 yards, fire became so intense that the infantry was pinned to the ground. At 1830, they returned to their former positions for defense.

At 0530, 16 September, the enemy counterattacked from the North and Northeast. The attack was in three close waves, and in succession our machine-guns literally mowed them down. Heavy casualties were inflicted on the enemy. Our attack in the direction of HAME started at 0700. Company "A", 36th Infantry, moved out with a section of tanks supporting it. The infantry was soon pinned down and both tanks hit. In the evening, this company was withdrawn to its former position for night defense.

On 18 September, same positions were kept, exchanging intermittent fire with the enemy.

In the early morning of 19 September, orders were issued by CO "A" for the 1st Battalion, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, to move at 0630 back to GEISBERG, thence to BUSCHMUEHLE, and pass through the 16th Infantry lines, attack MUMSTERBUSCH, and proceed to 9344. This move began at 0630, and the attack was launched at 1500. 3rd Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, was in direct support of the infantry. Shortly after the attack was launched, enemy AT, heavy artillery, and mortar fire was received. By 1815, our troops were in town. Several enemy tanks were in town, and some enemy infantry. On the morning of 20 September, the cleanup of the town began. Enemy infantry was in houses and cellars, and a house-to-house fight developed. One enemy tank was knocked out in the afternoon by a rocket-launcher. The position was consolidated, and contact made with the Task Force on the right in the late afternoon.

On 22 September, the position was taken over by 2nd Battalion, 16th Infantry, and our troops moved into assembly area South of BUSBACH.


Until 26 September, maintenance and rehabilitation were carried out. On 26 September, Task Force "X" (1st Battalion, 32nd Armored Regiment, 2nd Battalion, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment) moved into STOLBERG to relieve other units defending the city. These positions were held through the 30th of September 1944.

7. Commanders: The commander for the entire period was Colonel Leander L. Doan, except for the 4th of September, at which time the Executive Officer, Lt. Col. John K. Boles Jr., took command while Colonel Doan was undergoing treatment for wounds.
