I. Narrative of Events.

No change in organization except as noted in narrative report.

1 April The final drive on PADERBORN was started early in the morning by the 1st Bn, 33d Arm'd Regt on the left and the 2nd Bn 33d Arm'd Regt on the right. Enemy resistance continued to be mainly bazooka fire and some tanks from an SS Training Regiment. After destroying 3 Mk VI's, 2 Mk V's, 3 Mk IV's, 10 trucks and taking 350 PzW during 31 March - 1 April period, the 1st Bn was able to break all resistance and occupy PADERBORN, CP at 71376. 2nd Bn moved from HESINGHAUSEN via HETLEN then North and East to HOSKINGHAUSEN thence into PADERBORN with little resistance. Took 100 PzW. CP at 711474.

3rd Bn 33d Arm'd Regt lost a tank to bazooka fire but cleaned SALZKOTTEN up by 0100 and WENNER by 0200.

RUHR pocket sealed by contact of 2nd Armored Division with CC"A" vicinity LIPPSTADT.

2 April 2nd Bn sent force of light tanks, TD's, and infantry to DANL. Force reached this town by 1945. No enemy.

3rd Bn organized light tank patrols between WENNER and SALZKOTTEN.

3 April At 1500, a platoon of "F" Co, 33d Arm'd Regt and platoon of "D" Co, 36th AIR was sent to BAD LIPPSPRINGER (748544). No enemy opposition. After meeting elements of the 8th Armored Division this force of the 1st Bn returned to PADERBORN at 1800. MAJOR RALPH M. ROGERS assumed command of the 1st Bn 33d Arm'd Regt.

2nd Bn sent a force (2 tks plus 20 men) from HESINGHAUSEN to LIGHTSWAL to aid 33d Recon Bn.

3rd Bn sent medium tank patrol to SALZKOTTEN where it contacted the 8th Armored Division.

4 April 1st Bn 33d Arm'd Regt moved from PADERBORN at 1500 to HERBRAM (808423) clearing town and capturing 90 PzW.

2nd Bn moved out prepared to advance to the East along Southern most route of the Div (Route #4). 1st Bn further North was on left of 2nd Bn. CP 2nd Bn 761411.

5 April At 1100, 1st Bn moved to DRINGENBURG (915423). At 1900, orders were received to move as soon as possible to secure bridgeheads across the WESER RIVER. 1st Bn moved out at 2200 and advanced rapidly until it was stopped by bazooka fire at HAIKHOLE. MAJOR RALPH M. ROGERS, Bn CO was wounded in action.

2nd Bn was forced to use route of 1st Bn in order to bypass obstacle and then return to its Route #4. At end of day it had reached 010857.

Having united its force from SALZKOTTEN and its force from WENNER by 1730, the 3rd Bn moved to the East via CC"A" route (Northern sector of Div advance).

6 April Continuing on its route at daylight, the 1st Bn met enemy SA, bazooka, and arty fire at BORGHELE (085571) at 0900. By 1300, BORGHELE was cleared. MAJOR GEORGE T. STALLINGS assumed command of the Bn. HAARBUCK (112374) was reached by 2100. Civilians reported booby traps in the town, but only mines were encountered.

2nd Bn reached 130220 after overcoming tough terrain, bazooka teams some of which were civilian, and heavy arty fire.

3rd Bn lost vehicles due to "General Mud" but reached SCHNECHTEN (8-9544) by 0530.

7 April At 1100, 1st Bn reached HERSTELLE (165398). A bridge across the WESER RIVER was reported to be in at 183399. Co "A", "F", and "I" plus supporting infantry attempted to secure bridge, but were stopped by bazookas and direct fire from across the river. At 1500, enemy destroyed the bridge. During the day "A" Company lost 3 tanks, "F" Company 3 tanks, and "I" Company 6 tanks. At the end of the period 1st Bn (TF/W) had infantry in CARLSHAFEN.

2nd Bn ran into road blocks defended and undefended and encountered one tank. The Bn reached HELMARSCHAUSEN.

8 April 1st Bn secured CARLSHAFEN and continued patrolling action.

2nd Bn took hill 276 and continued working on bridge at HELMARSCHAUSEN.

3rd Bn 33d Armd Regt moved to assembly area East of WESER RIVER.

9 April At 0600, 60th Bn was relieved by 1st Inf Div. 1st and 2nd Bn 33d Armd Regt moved across WESER RIVER at GIESSELWENDER (2535) and were to go into an assembly area vicinity OFFENSHEN (3534). However, since the advance of 60th Howze had been so rapid (3rd Bn 33d Armd Regt was approaching NORTHEIM far to the East on the Division Northern Route) the Bn's continued through their assembly areas and reached the LEINE RIVER, 1st Bn at 5133, 2nd Bn at 5134. Enemy resisted with tanks and bazooka fire and obstacles. 2nd Bn worked on blown bridge 5134.

At 1245, 3rd Bn closed in assembly area at LÖWENHAGEN (G-3026). After taking HANDESHEN (G-4441) opposed by only scattered enemy resistance, the 3rd Bn was to secure NORTHEIM (G-4047) but met blown bridge at vicinity G-5447. "H" Company attempted to effect crossing to South but were stopped by stiff opposition vicinity SUMMER (G-5543). NORTHEIM was secured by 2400.

10 April 1st Bn crossed LEINE RIVER at 0730 reaching DUMERSTADT by 1130. Enemy resisted strongly at EPSCHENRODE (929275) and TREIRA (952270). Company "A" plus infantry attacked the former and F 47's bombed and strafed TREIRA. By 1800, both towns were cleared and 400 P&W taken. 1st Bn then moved to KEIN WERTHER (088246). P&W taken at EPSCHENRODE were from the 2nd Bn of the 594th Regt fresh from DENMARK.

2nd Bn reached GR WERTHER with little resistance.

3rd Bn jumped with final objective NORDHAUSEN. At 1230, 3 Tiger tanks were encountered 2000 yds Northeast GIEGOLDENHAUSEN (G-7435). Planes were used to attack them and reported 10 more enemy tanks. One tank was abandoned and the remainder withdrew. Enemy then blew bridge at G-7550. 3rd Bn therefore took trail through woods to the town of FOHLDE (G-7937 and then by mistake went South and ran into TP "H" vicinity EWING (-G-8232). 3rd Bn coiled in SILRHODE (G-8438) and BOCKELNHAGEN (G-3633) for night.

11 April 1st Bn attacked to seize Northern half of NORDHAUSEN while 2nd Bn attacked Southern half. Town was secured by 1100. At 1500, a force was sent to NIBERSACHSBERGEN to establish road blocks and investigate reports of a V-2 factory there. The road blocks were successfully installed and the V-2 factory captured while still in operation. One enemy Mk 3 tank was destroyed.

2nd Bn occupied its sector of NORDHAUSEN and also SUNDHAUSEN. A Labor camp with hundreds of sick, dying, and dead inmates was liberated. Medical care was given. One US secret agent was freed, and sent through channels to higher headquarters.

3rd Bn secured BARTOLSELN and OSTENHAGEN by 1100 and then by 2130 closed into NORDHAUSEN. Here the 3rd Bn, 47th Inf Regt (9th Inf Div) was attached to the TP in place of 3rd Bn, 414th (104th Inf Div) which had just been relieved from attachment.

12 April 1st Bn minus force left at NIBERSACHSBERGEN continued to HÖLLENSTADT (5926) closing into defensive positions there by 1830. 3 dual purpose 88mm AA guns were destroyed at LIEBERSDORF.

2nd Bn reached WOLFERSTEDT and ALLSTEDT.

3rd Bn jumped with objective of securing bridgehead over ELBE RIVER. Scattered enemy resistance and hasty road blocks were met. Bn was forced to coil in town of BLANKENHEIM (D-5629) due to gas shortage.

13 April 1st Bn moved out and ran into 2 4-88's at WOLFENBÜTTEL. Tank and arty fire destroyed these guns. At HILFEN over 400 English officers and men were released from internment. Advance continued Northeast through POLLENHAGEN, BURGSDORF, REIDENWITZ. At FRIEDENBURG 200 yds West of the SAALE river the Bn was stopped. "F" and "E" Companies of infantry cleaned up area East of river after 23rd Eng's had built bridge. "D" Co inf secured NOTENBURG.

2nd Bn destroyed 3-88mm guns and took 225 P&W reaching the SAALE RIVER. CP at 772377.

3rd Bn reached the SAALE RIVER vicinity NEULEHN (D-774b), capturing numerous PW and destroying one SP gun. RR bridge was captured intact.

14 April 1st Bn crossed the SAALE at 0700 and moved 33 miles before receiving enemy direct fire. This resistance came in the HOLDBERG forest South of DESSAU. "F" and "I" Company reached the RR crossing over the Autobahn 112620 and held here during the night. "A" Company plus infantry attempted to bypass resistance to the left (West) and were to occupy TORHEN (118648) but were held up on the North edge of the woods 1500 yds short of TORHEN by heavy enemy resistance in the form of SA, bazooka and arty fire. Civilians carrying bazookas were flushed out of the woods during this operation. They carried VOLKSSTURM certificates in their pockets but wore no arm bands. Enemy air was thrown against the 1st Bn and CG"R" Hq in the afternoon.

2nd Bn ran into stubborn defense vicinity D-8542 and lost 4 tanks and one half-track. By 1930, it was still receiving sniper and bazooka fire while cleaning up ZORBIG.

During the operation 9 female Air Force POW were captured. Also one civilian pilot who was shot down trying to evacuate plane from DESSAU. The roads were lined by inmates from various concentration camps especially from that at WANLEHN which was part of SS ARBEITSKOMMANDO AG of EICHENWALD.

3rd Bn crossed SAALE at BRUCKE (D-7745) and after small fight at KONNERN advanced to KOEHN (D-9258).

15 April 1st Bn units remained in same position while "F" and "E" Company secured a bridgehead over the MULDE RIVER vicinity 1335. During the night several enemy counterattacks on the bridgehead were repulsed with heavy losses on the enemy.

2nd Bn reached 133522 and also the town THULAND. A captured enemy document plus PW interrogation confirmed previous reports of organized resistance being formed. Two newly-formed Divisions "SCHANNHORST" and "ULRICH" von HUTTEN" were holding in the CG"R" sector. Document showed that 2nd Regt of Div "U von H" had moved from vicinity WITTENBERG to vicinity RAGUN where it attempted to recapture the Autobahn.

3rd Bn secured GR PASCHLEHN (D-8959). Received mortar and arty fire.

16 April 1st Bn continued to hold positions against harrasing bazooka and arty fire.

2nd Bn cleared RAGUN, PRIORAU, WANKE, SCHIRRAU, and SIMENHAUSEN. A force was sent to clear the road from 100610 to GR 107649 and then to turn East to TORHEN. This force reached vicinity 1065.

3rd Bn cleared MEREHN (D-9750) and LAUSIK (E-0059).

17 April 1st Bn cleared TORHEN by 1500 meeting only minor resistance.

2nd Bn CP and Service units were overrun by 150 infantry with bazookas at THULAND (100627) at 0130. Fortunately Bn CO was at CG"R" Hq. Important documents were successfully burned. PW later indicated that the enemy was the reinforced 2nd Company of the 1st Bn, 1st Regt of Ulrich von Hutten Division.

3rd Bn cleared ARN, FORST, JIBBENDORF, OSTERNENBURG, ELSWICK, and most of ZBRENT.

18 April 1st Bn held TORHEN and sent combat patrols to contact CG"Dog" vicinity RJ 107649. Due to AF and SA fire no contact was made.

2nd Bn maintained defense system vicinity RAGUN.

3rd Bn continued action at ROSENWALD, GORAU, SUSIKE. Bn then reverted temporarily to Division control.

19 - 23 April (Incl) 1st Bn continued mopping up operations in the Southeastern area of DESSAU. In the TORHEN area over 1000 enemy bazookas were destroyed on the 23 April.

3rd Bn took WULFEN (E-1450) on 19 April and by 1900 on 20 April they had taken part of EL KURNAU (E-9569). On the 21 April the Bn reached the East edge of DESSAU and the following day the ELBE RIVER. Enemy resisted with road blocks and bazooka-men.

During the period units were alerted for possible contact with the Russians.

24 April After relief by the 9th Inf Div Combat Command, "B" released all units to their parent organization. 33d Armored Regiment began to operate as a Regiment.

with all its units and officers and men under Regimental Control for the first time since beginning of combat in France. The area occupied was just East of NORDHAUSEN. Hq and Hq Co 1st Bn were located at ROTLENRODE (230300), Company "A" at HERSINGEN (231275), "F" Company at ROTLENRODE (231288) and "I" Company at UFTINGEN (252272). 2nd Bn moved to TILDA. Regimental Hq was at HERINGEN. A period of rest, reorganization and rehabilitation was begun.

25 April 3rd Bn was relieved by elements of the 9th Inf Div and moved to vicinity GORSHACH (D-2222) where Bn and Hq Co was billeted. "G" Company was in BESLEN, "H" Company in WINDHAUSEN and "C" Company in HUNDHAUSEN.

25 - 30 April Continuation of program of rest, reorganization and rehabilitation. On 29 April 1st Bn moved to BAD RANKENHAUSEN and vicinity. Regimental Hq to SCHNIBHAUSEN.

Military government was contacted in BONDERSHAUSEN. Arrangements were made to place a CIC screen on the town. Guards were placed on the JUNKERS AIRCRAFT Administrative offices in town.
